Obligation and Mortgage

On the twenty seventh of the Month of September  
in the Year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred  
and fifty Nine. Before the Honourable Members  
of the said duly constituted and chosen in and  
for that part of the Province of Canada formerly  
called Lower Canada sitting in the District  
of Saint Francis in the said Province.

That your said Court was appeared Francis John  
Cough and Charles Cough both of the County  
of England in the said Province, Esquires who  
acknowledged themselves to be justly indebted  
on the day of the said date unto William  
Cough of the City of London in that part of the  
United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland  
Esquire Esquire, Merchants & particu-  
larly and jointly by a duly certified copy  
and delivery of certain Books of the above  
of the said Francis John Cough and Charles  
Cough the said certain Books as each of said  
said books contain a party to be received  
and accepted for the said Edmund Cough  
his own use and enjoyment in the sum of Five  
hundred and fifty pounds Sterling Money  
of Great Britain of lawful receipt and value  
the said Francis John Cough and Charles  
Cough hereby agreed to have received their  
said value of said money from the said  
Edmund Cough previous to the execution  
hereof in money lent and advanced.

And which said sum of Five hundred  
pounds and fifty pounds Sterling Money  
was paid the said Francis John Cough  
and Charles Cough hereby received and  
accepted

erect and made.

Secondly, that certain track or piece of  
land situated lying and being in the said  
township of Whipton more particularly known  
and distinguished as the North West half of  
the South West moiety of the lot number  
twenty in the eighth range or lots in the  
said township of Whipton, containing fifty  
superficial acres and the vicinage for  
highway now as last.

And for the execution hereof the parties  
have agreed that no more lot or more  
particular piece of vicinage shall be

shown and parcelled out to the town  
ship of Whipton in the said vicinage  
in the said range of lots than the number  
the vicinage of the lot number

Four hundred and sixty  
in the said range and that the vicinage  
shall be the same.

In testimony whereof the said  
parties having been represented as  
aforesaid have signed both and in the  
presence of us the said Notaries their  
names having been first duly read in  
their presence.
